



WHAT IS SIN

Introduction: In an age when the world looks lightly upon sin and that which is contrary to the character of God, it is incumbent upon the people of God to clearly articulate what they believe holiness is. The people of God are called upon to be “holy” (1 Peter 1:16). The problem that immediately faces the believer is that they have “fallen short,” and they require the Spirit of God to perform that which pleases God (Galatians 5:16).
